 Withell three poundes Item I doe give and bequeath unto my daughter Elmi Withell  
 three poundes And my will is that if any one of my daughters dye before they  
 attaine to the discretion of disposing of the legacie given on or either of them  
 that then it be equally divided by my Executors betweene the Survivors And if

two of them doe before their ability of disposing that then the whole remainger  
 due and be paid to the Survivors Item all the rest of my goods lands and  
 chattels not given and bequeathed I give to Anne Littlell my wife whom I account  
 and adorne to be my sole executrix And to pay my debts and legacies I have paid  
 discharge a widowe And if it happen that Anne Littlell now my wife doe marry  
 my debts and marry that then all my lands goods and chattels be equally divided  
 between my three daughters And that Anne now my wife make perfect account  
 of all my goods to Anne And that shee be my only executrix And all my goods  
 interred of de. goods and debts I followe and discharge in willed and bequeathed

 must yield unto death when it shall please God so that I doe make constitute  
 declare and declare this my last will and Testament in manner and forme  
 followinge: I bequeath and assigne by single gift unto all and every Testament and  
 Testaments will and wille hereafter by mee made and declared either by word  
 or by writinge And this to be taken in my last will and Testament and  
 none other And first beinge penitent and sorrowfull for the sinnes of my life  
 my sinnes past most humbly desireinge forgiveness of the same I give and  
 bequeath my soule to Almighty God my Saviour and Redeemer in whom and by  
 the merits of Jesus Christ I trust and believe assuredly to be saved and so have full  
 remission and forgiveness of my sinnes And that my soule with my bodye at the  
 generall day of resurrection shall rise againe with joy And my bodye to be buried in  
 the Church of the town of Dorset aforesaid Item I give to the Church of Dorset  
 twenty shillings Item I give to the poor people of Dorset County shillings  
 to be distributed by the Churchwardens of this parish of Dorset County  
 Item I give unto the said Church of Dorset and to the vicar thereof  
 want I have made unto the said Church of Dorset and vicar thereof  
 for want of some male unto John Dando the vicar of the aforesaid  
 Church of Dorset and vicar thereof because it should continue in the  
 name of the said John Dando for my Cousin William Dando the said Dando
